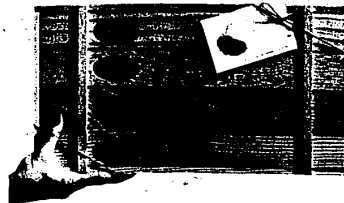

credentials was able to cut down a tremendous amount of red tape for both American and British young Jews who otherwise may have had a rough time getting clearances to move from one place to another.

Rabbi Spectre described himself as "a way-paver" for student tours, some of which have taken him to Russia concerning the refuseniks — those Jews who have made known their preference

to leave the Soviet Union and have lost their jobs because of it.

His interest in Russian Jewry is very high, and his interest in the young continues here with a recent acceptance to serve on the board of Hillel Day School of Metropolitan Detroit.

Rabbi Spectre will receive guests at a reception for the general public, state and local officials, beginning at 8:30 p.m. Saturday, April 21, in the synagogue.
