Cancer detection project will be led by Linda Ross

Farmington Hills resident Linda Ross has been named coordinator of the Michigan Cancer Foundation's "Oral Cancer Detection Program."

"The mouth is an easy area to examine for cancerous changes; still, nearly 9,000 Americans will die of it this year," she said. "Death from this type of cancer is not only unnecessary, but often avoidable through early detection."

Ms. Ross graduated from University of Michigan and earned an M.S. degree in dental public health from Boston University.

Before joining the Michigan Cancer Foundation, she was with the Detroit House of Correction, where she expanded the dental program for inmates.

She is a consultant for the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare's Indian Health Service.

SINCE PAIN is not an early sign of oral cancer, many people are unaware of its presence until the disease is advanced. A screening examination can often pick up early signs of oral cancer, such as white or red patches, sores, lumps or swellings.

It is a simple and painless examination of the mouth and neck by a specially trained dental hygienist.

"While this type of examination is important for all men and women over 40," Ms. Ross said, "we are basically urging people who smoke, use snuff, chew tobacco, drink alcohol or do these

in combination, to have regular annual exams."

The cancer foundation offers free oral cancer screening examinations at its service centers in Dearborn, Detroit, Grosse Pointe Woods, Royal Oak and its Detroit Medical Center headquarters.

Those in the Farmington area are asked to use the Royal Oak center. To schedule an appointment, persons may call 549-4600.
