In May 1977, Frye sought the advice of students and faculty in the department and in allied programs on campus. A Theater Separation Committee was appointed and last March reported it favored separation. The college executive committee last April voted to recommend to regents the establishment of an interdepartmental Department of Theater and Drama. "Separate status will make the University of Michigan better able to attract good students and faculty," Shapiro reported. "The Professional Theater proposed reorganization." Establishment of a separate department will "give coherence and integrity to the diverse yet related disciplines which make up the theater arts," Shapiro said.

University of Michigan Regents have approved establishing a Department of Theater and Drama, effective July 1. The new department will consist of the theater section of the Department of Speech Communication and Theater.

"The Department of Theater and Drama will serve as the focus for inter-Drama will serve as the focus for inter-disciplinary programs in the perform-ing arts." reported Billy E. Frye, dean of the College of Literature, Science and the Arts, and Harold T. Shapiro, vice president for academic affairs. "The justification for establishing an independent Department of Theater and Drama is based on intellectual and practical grounds," Frye said.

"As a separate unit the department will be better able to handle its internal administration and will be able to work directly with allied areas, such as music, art, dance and the drama programs in the English Department and the Residential College."
