Farmington area homeowners may be in line for federal aid if President Jimmy Carter grants Gov. William Milliken's request for funds to help storm-stricken southern Oakland Coun-

If Carter grants the state emergency funds, cities can be reimbursed for cleaning up debris and for damage to public property.

Homeowners would be able to apply for low-interest loans through the federal covernment.

Members of the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration will visit the area this week to check the damage costs submitted to the federal government by local communities and the state, according to Kenneth Frankland, Milliken's Iegal assistant.

"I'm particularly pleased with the firsts in news writing and feature writing," and faculty adviser Doug Johnson. "These are two key areas, and it means the Globe is building on a tradition of strong writing." Johnson was disappointed the Globe didn't fare better in judging of the best messpaper, conceding, "We lack a certain consistency of content balance at times."

MICHIGAN TWO-YEAR College Press Day was organized by a group of community colleges after an earlier group, the Michigan Collegiate Media Association, folded.

Held at Lansing Community College, press day featured seminars on interviewing, investigative reporting, head-line witing photojournalism and a keynotic speech by U.S. Rep. Robert Carr, D-Lansie for more coverage of such substantive issues as the SALT (strategic arms limitation treaty) talks and less sensationalism.
