

# Brother Rice cage star is self-motivated

Tim Andree, Birmingham Brother Rice's 6-foot-11 senior center, is what psychologists might call a self-motivated individual; he sets goals for himself and then accomplishes them.

A list of these basketball accomplishments includes All-Observer & Eccentric, All-Catholic League, All-Metro and All-State honors. He was also named a second-team All-American by Parade magazine.

Recently, Andree has been a man on the go. He, and other top high school basketball players, have been playing in all-star basketball games and tournaments around the country. Andree has played in the McDonald's East-West game at Charlotte, N.C., the Capital City Classic in Washington, D.C., and the Dapper Dan tournament in Pittsburgh, Pa. He will lead a contingent of Michigan High School all-stars against the Yugoslavian national

team in a two-game series scheduled for April 20 and 22. He'll close out his post-season play the weekend of April 28 and 29 in the Derby Festival tournament at Louisville, Ky.

"Ever since I was a little kid," said Andree, "I've dreamed of playing in games like these, and I did it. It kind of restores your faith in yourself; you can control your own destiny."

The only bad thing about the games, according to Andree, is the demands

they make upon his time. He said he wished that the games were scheduled for a different time of the year. Andree carries a 3.2 grade point average at Brother Rice and explained that the traveling made it hard to keep his grades up.

"I'm pretty happy with the way I've been playing," said Andree. "Of course, no one plays as well as they want to."

Andree's best game so far has been against the Pennsylvania team in the

Dapper Dan tournament. He scored 16 points and had nine rebounds against a team led by 7-foot-1 Sam Bowie, one of the best players in the country.

Bowie was held to just seven points and three rebounds in what Andree called a very physical game.

Bowie said afterwards that he intended to spend the summer lifting weights. Said Andree, "I used the one advantage I had; he's taller than me, but I outweighed him by 30 pounds."

Andree said that playing against Bowie and 7-foot-3 Ralph Sampson were interesting experiences; they were two of the three or four people he has ever had to look up to, he said.

Next year, Andree will play basketball at the University of Notre Dame. He has already started making goals

for himself: He wants to contribute as a freshman, make the All-America team and lead Notre Dame to four straight NCAA national basketball championships.

"I don't think it would hurt me to make my goals high," said Andree.

After college, Andree plans to attend law school. "It's something I've thought about for a long time, something to shoot for," he said.

Andree wants to follow after his older brother Jerry who is already a lawyer. "I really respect him," he said, "and I respect what he's doing."

If Andree can accomplish all of his future goals, he might end up trading a basketball jersey for a three-piece suit and make a transition from the basketball court to the law court.
