

## Book luncheon stars 3 guests

The second children's book and author luncheon will be held at The Community House, April 30.

The award-winning writers who will be the guests are Carol Fenner, Virginia Hamilton and Ed Young. Ms. Fenner won the Christopher award in 1973 for "Gorilla, Gorilla." Ms. Hamilton is distinguished for being the only writer to have won the Newberry Medal and the National Book Award for her story "M.C. Higgins the Great."

Young, an illustrator, won a Caldecott Honor Award for "The Emperor and the Kite." The book was written by Jane Yolen and published last year. Yolen was born in Tientsin, China and raised and educated in Shanghai and later Hong Kong. He came to the United States to study architecture, but became interested in illustration and design. He studied at Los Angeles Art Center and later at Pratt Institute in Brooklyn where he taught for many years.

In addition to his Caldecott Honor book, he has illustrated "The Girl Who Loved the Wind," by Ms. Yolen, "The Red Lion" by Diane Wolkstein and his latest, "White Wave," also done in collaboration with Ms. Wolkstein. "The Girl Who Loved the Wind" and "The Red Lion" were American Institute of Graphic Arts book show selections.

Ms. Hamilton's first book, "Zeezy," was published in 1967. Since that initial splash into the literary field, she has won every major award or honor accorded to American authors of children's books. Her works have been translated into German, Dutch and Japanese. Some of her books are on record, most have come out in paperback. She is the youngest child of the Perry family of Yellow Springs, Ohio, established there by a grandfather who fled slavery.

Ms. Fenner, formerly an actress, dancer, teacher, designer, copywriter and editor, now lives in Battle Creek. With sponsorship from Michigan Council for the Arts, she regularly visits elementary and junior high schools around the state and teaches creative writing workshops. Among her books are "Tiger in the Cellar," "Christmas Tree on the Mountain," "Lagalee, the Wanderer," and her most recent, "The Skates of Uncle Richard."

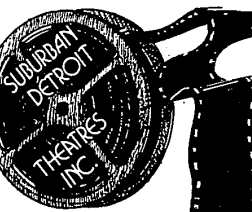
