# Bowling fundraisers to fight cystic fibrosis

Four Oakland County bowling centers will participate in an April 22 bowling event designed to aid those who have cystic fibrosis.

Anyone who signs up five sponsors who promise to pay a penny per pin will be able to bowl between the hours of noon and 5 p.m. at Country Lanes in Farmington, West Bloomfield Lanes, Avon Recreation in Rochester or Yorba Linda Lanes in Royal Oak.

Each bowler must bowl three games, paying \$1.50 per game plus shoe rental fees if needed.

The four bowlers at each site who enlist the highest number of contributing sponsors will be in the running for house prizes. In addition the grand prize of a trip for two to Hawaii has been donated by Hamilton, Miller, Hudson & Fayne Travel of Southfield.

Each bowler who turns in money from 15 or more sponsors will receive a special T-shirt.

Eighteen locations in the metropolitan area are joining in the fundraiser which will earmark funds for the Cystic Fibrosis Center in Children's Hospital, Detroit, and other CF centers in Michigan.

Funds raised will be used for care, treatment and research into cystic fibrosis, the leading genetic disease in causing death of children. It is a congenital disorder of mucous glands throughout the body, developing during childhood and causing pancreatic insufficiency and pulmonary disorders.

Sue Daschke of Rochester, who, with her husband John, is heading the bowling action at Avon Recreation Center, said she is "one of the fortunate ones" in that she has reached adulthood although afflicted with CF.

"So, for me, the Bowlerama is kind of a personal goal," she said. "I'd like to see other children eventually reach adulthood, too."

Milt and Wendy Spokojny are in charge of those signing up to bowl at Country Lanes in Farmington, and for the West Bloomfield Lanes it is Jerry and Rose Jablonski. Marge and Bill Mooney are the representatives for Yorba Linda.

# Abortion rights topic

"Abortion and the Right to Choose" is the theme of a conference to be held in Detroit on Monday, April 23, under sponsorship of the Michigan Religious Coalition for Abortion Rights, a coalition of 27 Protestant, Jewish, Roman Catholic and other religious organizations.

The event will be held 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Hartford Avenue Baptist Church, 18700 James Couzens, and costs \$3 which includes lunch. For information or lunch reservation, call Helen Howe at 882-6250.

Norman DePuy, keynote speaker, is minister of the First Baptist Church of Dearborn. Before coming to Michigan he was executive director of the division of communications, American Baptist Churches.

In that post he was responsible for both audio and print media, and also for television and film. He also has served as chairman of the Southeast Area Board of American Baptist Churches in Michigan.

Responding to his address will be Margaret Maxey, Ph.D., and Rabbi Ernst Conrad. Ms. Maxey is a national board member of Catholic Alternatives and a sponsor of the national Religious Coalition for Abortion Rights. Rabbi Conrad is the founder of Temple Kol Ami in West Bloomfield.

An address by former state senator N. Lorraine Beebe, "Is There a Religious War in Our Future?" will conclude the morning's events. Ms. Beebe was a member of the Michigan Senate before and during the Michigan abortion referendum campaign (1970-72).

She initiated and fought for abortion law reform in the state legislature in the years prior to the referendum. She is an Episcopalian laywoman.

A luncheon and afternoon workshops will conclude the conference.
