Three Farmington girls were recently named to Valparaiso University's chapter of Alpha Lambda Delta, the national freshman honor society. Julie Ann Trevisan and Deborah Cecchini, both of Farmington Hills, and Kathryn Lehman of Farmington were the local youths named to the society. Membership in the society consists of freshmen who have earned a 3.5 grade point average (based on a 4.0 scale) or better. Members are initiated in the spring of their freshman year and, while always members of the society, they are active only through their sophomore year.

## Safety patroller tours Gettysburg battlefield

A Farmington Hills student is among 50 school safety patrollers chosen statewide to tour the nation's capital and historic Gettysburg battlefield May 2-5 during the 39th annual Automobile Club of Michigan safety patrol trip.

Ray Voss, 12, son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Voss, 32402 Dunford, who attends Kenbrook school, is among those making the all-expense-paid, four-day trip to Washington D.C. and the Civil War battle site.

The 10-14-year-olds are the state's

top patrollers for the 1978-79 school year. They represent 65,000 Michigan youngsters who each spend nearly 300 hours annually protecting classmates at crosswalks and on buses.

Previous trips also have taken Michigan patrollers to Washington, Hershey, Pa., and the Canadian National Safety Patrol Rally in Ottawa.

This year's trip begins May 2 when those from outside metropolitan Detroit arrive in Dearborn for an overnight stay at the Fairlane Inn.

Upon arrival at Washington's Na-

tional Airport, patrollers will travel by bus to the Smithsonian Institution's National Air and Space Museum for lunch and a tour.

A drive-by tour of capital sites is followed by a two-hour bus trip to Gettysburg for dinner and an overnight stay.

After breakfast, Friday, patrollers will receive orientation by viewing a giant electrified battlefield map and take a two-hour guided tour of the area.

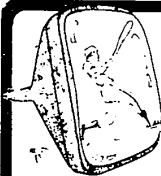
