Under Tirrell's leadership, the award-winning Orchard Ridge Campus was built, making OCC, at that time, a multi-campus institution with three campuses. OCC gained national recognition for its audio-tuterial approach to education under Tirrell's leadership.

He has been a teacher and principal in Michigan public schools, assistant di-rector of the Harvard Center for Field Studies, and was dean of the Grand Ra-pids Junior College from 1955 to 1958.

High school and college students from across the state will get profes-sional tips on how to become involved in politics at a May 18-21 conference at


