1978: Record sales year

A record 3.905.000 existing single-family homes were sold nationally during 1978, up 9.3 percent from the previous high set in 1977, the National Associaton of Realtors report.

"The 1978 total of 3,905,000 existing home sales shattered the old record of 3,572,000 set just a year earlier," said Donald I. Hovde, association president.

"The unprecedented demand for single-family homes touched all sections of the nation, with records being set in each region of the U.S."

Sales in the South led the way, with 1,638,000 homes changing hands in 1978. In the North Central region, 1,058,000 single-family homes were sold; the West, 646,000 resale homes; and the Northeast, 566,000.

Nationally, the median price for existing single-family homes rose \$200 in December to \$50,900. This figure represents a 15.2 percent rise from December 1977 to December 1978.

In the South, the median price was up 16.7 percent to \$46,800; the North Central region, 16.5 percent to \$44,400; West, 12.3 percent to \$67,500; and the Northeast, 11.5 percent to \$50,600.

Sales in December were at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 4,160,000 units, down from November's

4,350,000 rate but 3.2 percent ahead of the same month a year ago when the adjusted rate was 4,030,000, Hovde noted.

"This marks the third consecutive month that annualized sales of existing homes topped 4 million, so it ap-pears that people still would rather purchase now than run the risk that mortgage money will not be available in the months ahead," he added.
