

From jazz to madrigal, from pop to barbershop

Southfield's Tel-12 Mall will be the focal point for metropolitan-area musicians during National Music Week, May 6-12.

Theme for the year is "Music — the Great Humanizer," which will be adopted by bands, choruses, ensembles, choirs, bell ringers and singers.

The sponsoring groups in this area are the Farmington and Birmingham Musicales, which put together the local celebration. National Music Week is patronized by the National Federation of Music Clubs.

Organizers aim to help people appreciate music better by offering free performances by singers and bands. Jazz, madrigal, pop and barbershop are

some of the music forms which will be played.

Grinnell Music Stores will add something new to the week-long playlist with a solo performance each day at 5:30 p.m. by one of its pianists or organists.

THE OPENING ACT of the week features the big band sound of Paul Barber and his Farmington Community Jazz Band at 3 p.m. Sunday, May 6. The Bloomfield Lahser Jazz Ensemble, a group from Cranbrook High School's concert band, take the podium at 12:30 p.m. Monday.

That evening, at 7:30 p.m. the spotlight falls on the Kingswood Madrigal Singers from Cranbrook, directed by Nina Studebaker.

At 1 p.m. Tuesday, Don Ross directs the Power Junior High School Band, which boasts 55 young musicians who perform even-popular band selections.

At 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, the Waterford Mott Chamber Singers are directed by Melvin Rookus with a repertoire that runs from Bach to Broadway.

Wednesday, the Brother Rice High School Concert Band, directed by Jim Collins, plays at 1 p.m., and the Southfield High Jazz Ensemble, with director Paul Lipa, is scheduled at 7 p.m.

Fifth and sixth graders sing, dance and perform at 1 p.m. Thursday. Carolyn Tower directs the youngsters, who are members of the Cranbrook School-Brookside Forward Off Group.

Thursday evening's performance comes from the Covington Junior High Choral Ensembles in Birmingham. Joanne Boraks directs three ninth grade groups.

FRIDAY'S BILL features two groups from Bloomfield Hills.

The West Hills Junior High Jazz Rock Ensemble will play under the direction of James Smela at 1 p.m.

The East Hills Junior High Treble Choir, directed by Mark Smith, take the stage at 7:30 p.m.

The spotlight falls on The Festive Ringers at 1 p.m. Saturday. The group of 10 perform music on English hand bells under the direction of Shirley Harden.

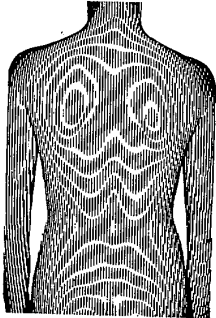

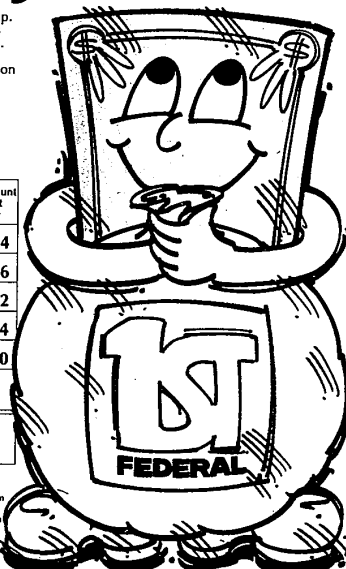
