Experiences of life often intersect commitments of faith at unexpected places. The incident at Three Mile Island does not evoke the conventional portrayal of Armageddon where the demonic spirits of the world will assemble for battle on the great day of

God Almighty (Revelation 16:14).

"The words of T.S. Eliot in his poem 'The Hollow Men' seem much more descriptive."

"This is the way the world ends
This is the way the world ends
Not with a bang but with a whimper."

PERHAPS THAT is a clue to our present malady. Instead of framing the incident on Three Mile Island in our relationship with God, we have regarded

it as a mere problem of technology. Instead of a cataclysmic battle with evil, we see it as a machine that has malfunctioned, has malfunctioned.

The Bible has little to say about machines that malfunction, but it does have a great deal to say about people who misplace their trust and hope. As Mark Twain observed, what troubles us about the Bible is not what we fail to understand, but what we understand quite clearly and cannot stomach.

In the book of Judges there is a story of a group of Danites stealing Micah's graven image. And when Micah finally catches up with them, he bespeaks a condition of life that is common to idleness. "You take my gods which I made. . . and what have I left?" he asks, (Judges 18:24).

Someday we'll hear what that says and believe it. And when we carry out what God's love created in us.

2 Lutheran groups join in conference at WMU

Delegates from two Lutheran groups — the American Lutheran Church and the Michigan Synod of the Lutheran Church in America — will meet simultaneously on the campus of Western Michigan University at Kalamazoo Wednesday through Saturday, May 9-12.

Congregational representatives of these two groups of Michigan Lutherans will meet jointly to hear three speakers.

Under the theme of "Discovering

Discipleship," Dr. Lee E. Snook of Luther Theological Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota will speak on "Our Potential"; Dr. William Stringfellow, attorney, theologian and social critic, will speak on "Our Challenge"; and Dr. Faith E. Burgess of Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, will speak on "Our Hope."

In addition to these joint lecture sessions, the two groups of Lutherans will meet together in worship and to hear their respective "State of the Church" messages.
