Anglers beginning to score

So far, fishing results are only dribbling in — but it makes you feel spring is coming.

Angilers in Oakland County's Moss and Proud lakes are catching some trout. The lakes are upstream from the headwaters of the Huron River, where angilers using files only have been enjoying put-take fishing since April 1...

Inland lake fishing is still generally slow. Bluegills are still in deeper water and haven't moved onto the shallow spawning beeds.

Lake St. Clair fishing reports are unexciting: "some" jumbo perch south of Metro Beach, small perch around Harsen's Island, spotty salmon catches in the lake and St. Clair River, "slow and spotty' walleye fishing.

AN ALLERGIST friend says there is a new form of immunotherapy against stings of honeybees, hornets, wasps and yellow jackets. Such bites hurt anyone, but one million to two million American suffer severe allergic reactions — in some cases, death.

He suggests you have an allergist give you skin tests if you have serious reactions to one or more of these insects. If skin tests are positive, you can start venom therapy and continue it indefinitely. It's expensive, he says. Weekly injections are required at first, but within six months the interval is extended to monthly.
