

Farmington undergoes treatment

Farmington is sprucing up for spring with the annual Keep Farmington Beautiful campaign during May. As in other years, the city's program coincides with the statewide campaign which culminates on May 19, the first day of Michigan Week.

Among the activities sponsored by the city of Farmington Beautification Committee this month is its "Dirty Picture Contest." Persons over 18 years old are requested to send in photos, drawings, paintings and sketches which depict areas in the community which need attention and improvement.

The deadline for the contest is May 14. Pictures should be sent to "Dirty Picture Contest," Farmington City Hall, 23500 Liberty, Farmington 48024. Entries should be kept to a maximum size of 11x14 inches. Senders should include their names, addresses and telephone numbers.

For those too young to enter a dirty picture contest, there is the "Imagination Contest." School-age children are asked to create a poster showing how Farmington should look. Entrants have their choice of coloring materials. Prizes for the top posters will be awarded on Community Pride Day, May 19, in the Downtown Farmington Center.

ENTRIES SHOULD BE MAILED TO city hall no later than May 14 and should include the name, address, phone number, school and age of entrant.

The flower and shrub sale on May 18-19 in the fountain area of the Downtown Farmington Center, Grand River near Farmington Road, will include an assortment of perennials as well as annuals and geraniums. Sale hours will be from 9 a.m. - 9 p.m. on May 18 and from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. on May 19.

The perennials, a new addition to the sale will be supplied by Hughes Gardens. Geraniums will again be provided by Springbrook Gardens. The Floral Boutique will supply small plants and the Beautification Committee will be selling small shrubs.

Proceeds from the sale will be used for plantings throughout the city. The tulips and hyacinths in the mini-park areas were planted in past years using proceeds from the sale. "Keep Farmington Beautiful" T-shirts will be sold again this year at the flower and shrub sale.

The task of cleaning up Farmington will be tackled this month. The cleaning program is behind schedule this year after the ice storm and power failures last month. Litter along Freedom

is the target for Boy Scout Troop 179 led by Rick Shrewsbury and five other scouts working for their Eagle Scout award.

THEY WILL BE conducting another cleanup project along Orchard Lake Road from Ten Mile to Lamar as part of another state-wide clean up project sponsored by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs.

The area on State between Liberty

and Farmington Road will be cleaned. Weeds will be picked. Troop 45 from the First United Methodist Church is working with the Beautification Committee on another clean up project.

"Keep Farmington Beautiful" project is led by committee chairwoman Jackie Stever. The City Beautification Committee meets at 8 p.m. the second Thursday of each month at Farmington City Hall, except during the month of August.

U of M student earns high engineering award

Michael T. Koinis, a University of Michigan engineering student, has been awarded the 1979 Schlumberger Collegiate Award.

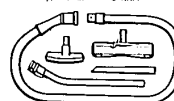

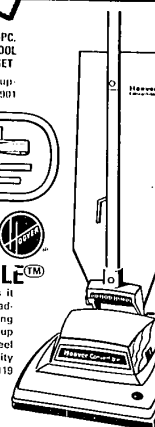

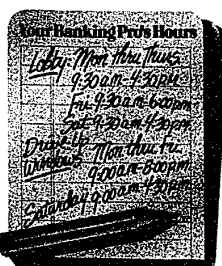
