

Andover trackmen race past Kettering

Weight man Jeff Scherman and distance runner Tom Buford led Bloomfield Hills Andover to an 86-46 win over Waterford Kettering Tuesday.

Scherman won both the shot put and the discus throw (134-6). Buford won both the mile and the two mile (10:05.5).

Field event winners, other than Scherman, were Scott Harris in the pole vault (12-0) and Steve Watkeys in the long jump (19-2).

In the running events, Mark Vestevich won the 110-yard high hurdles (16.4), George Henney won the 100-yard dash (10.6), Ken Cutler won the 330-yard low hurdles (43.1) and Barry Tonn won the 880-yard run (2:06).

The Andover relay team of Vestevich, Mike Carrol, Mike Donaldson and Henney took both the 880-yard relay (1:41.7) and the 440-yard relay (46.5).

Andover, 3-0 for the year, will be at West Bloomfield on Tuesday.

Tim Cannon and Dave Marion tied for first-place honors in the mile run with a 4:51.0 clocking. Charlie d'Alberston placed first in the 440-yard run, and Evan Moore won the two-mile race in 10:22.6.

The Cranes face Temple Woods on Tuesday.

COUNTRY DAY 72, LUTHERAN EAST 55 — The Yellow Jackets won their second dual meet in three tries Thursday, taking four of the five field events and seven of the 11 running races.

"We switched around a few guys, but they (Lutheran East) gave us a good meet," said Country Day coach George Browne. "They had a pretty scrappy team."

Mark Fenitress was the meet's only triple winner, taking high jump (5-8) and long jump (19-8 1/2) honors in the field events and grabbing a first in the 220-yard dash (23.4).

Jeff Craig won the 120-yard high hurdles (17.1), Don Cook took the mile (4:53.1), Doug Steward won the 880-yard run (2:12.0) and Charles Keller topped all the two miles (10:42).

Country Day won two of the three relays — winning the 440-yard relay in 48.0 and the mile relay in 3:42.0.

Dave Dargis won the shot-put competition (42-9) and Ed Guidini won the 220-yard dash (23.4).

earned a first-place finish in this dual meet.

Tom Robinson improved in the long jump with a first-place leap of 19-6. Mark Redman was a double winner in both the 220-yard and 440-yard dashes.

Bill Kendro won the 100-yard dash in 10.4, and the 440-yard relay team of Kendro, John Russell, Lee Morof and Mike Glass placed first with a time of 46.0.

Steve Ross placed second in the discus, and Scott Harper ran his best time ever in the 880-yard run (2:04.0)

for a second-place finish.

BLOOMFIELD HILLS LAHSER 96, TROY ATHENS 36 — The Knights ran all over Athens in this Monday dual meet.

Athens won only the long jump, the pole vault and the mile relay.

Senior righthander Steve Sudbay fired a one-hitter to lead West Bloomfield past Greater Oakland Athletic League (GOAL) rival Rochester, 3-0, last Wednesday.

Sudbay surrendered just four walks and struck out nine in collecting his first win of the season.

Steve Swanson scored the only run Sudbay needed in the first inning, as he doubled, stole third and scored on a squeeze bunt by Bob Pasceletti.

The Lakers scored single runs in the sixth and seventh frames to secure the win, their third of the season without a loss.

John Alexander, a senior, led the West Bloomfield hitting attack with a three-for-four performance and one run batted in. Bruce Buffmyer knocked in the other Laker run.

Last Tuesday, another fine pitching performance enabled West Bloomfield to claim their second straight win of the season by a 3-2 score over Farmington Harrison.

Jim Arnold, a junior righthander, went the distance for the Lakers, allowing just six hits and one walk while striking out three. Only one of the two Harrison runs were earned.

West Bloomfield scored all three of its runs in the fourth inning after two were out. Trailing 1-0 at the time, Arnold started it out with a single. Mike Roman walked before Sudbay, playing rightfield, doubled home two runs. After another walk, David Ward singled home Sudbay with the eventual winning run.

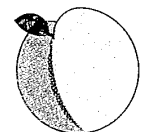

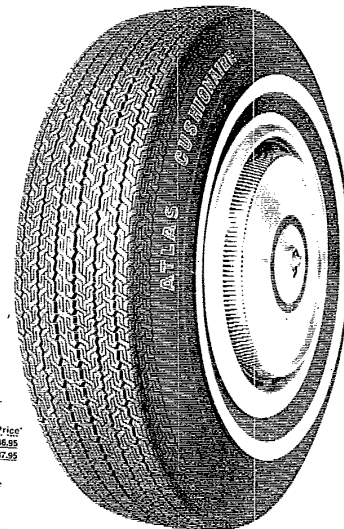
