

Time to spruce up yard with trees and shrubs

If you want to add a little luster to that backyard, the Farmington Hill Beautification Commission will give you the chance.

The Commission is offering five types of trees and three kinds of bushes to add to the surroundings.

The stock is potted and well-developed. The potted shade trees are one inch to 1 1/2 inches in diameter; ornamentals are three to four feet tall. Deadline for orders is May 12. Trees are to be picked up at Steinke Nursery, 20815 Farmington Road, on May 19 between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. For those residents who wish to have trees and shrubs delivered, there is a \$15.00 charge per address.

It is suggested that neighbors get together and have the trees delivered to one address.

Items offered are:
• Skyline locust — It has a distinct pyramidal form. Has dark green leathery leaves more closely spaced and larger than the average locust. It matures to 45 feet.

• Majestic locust — Practically no seeding. It is a graceful tree of spreading growth habit. It does well in drought or wet soils. It matures to 45 feet.

• Red Sunset maple — Bright orange-red fall color remaining for two weeks. Upright spreading when young, becoming oval later on. Attractive silver bark. Maturing to 50 feet.

• Emerald queen Norway — Moderate to rapid growth. Excellent branching habit with distinct attractive bright yellow fall color. Maturing to 50 feet.

• Marshall's Ash — Free of seeds. Beautiful bright lemon-yellow fall color. Rapid grower. Very hardy. Best green ash variety available. Maturing to 55 feet.

• Burning bush — Compact, slow growing shrub. Excellent hedge or specimen. Brilliant red fall color. Maturing to four to five feet.

• Forsythia — Erect branching habit smothered with deep yellow flowers. Excellent for sheared or unshaped hedge. Maturing to six feet.

• Purple leaf plum bush — Very hardy shrub with rich purple-red foliage. White spring flowers. Prefers full sun. Maturing to six feet.

Trees cost \$29.95. The bushes sell for \$6 with the exception of the purple leaf plum bush which costs \$8.

Brodhead appointed to budget committee

U.S. Representative William Brodhead, D-Detroit, has been named to four task forces on the House Budget Committee.

Brodhead, whose district includes Farmington, Farmington Hills, Southfield, Redford Township and northwest Detroit, has been appointed to task forces on defense and international affairs, tax expenditures and tax policy, state and local governments and expenditures and spending limitations.

The defense panel will consider expenditures for national defense and such programs as foreign aid.

The tax expenditure task force will cover such things as tax incentives, deductions and credits, as well as the economic aspects of government organizations and regulatory policies.

The state and local government task force will study the overall impact of federal economic and budget policies on the states and their political subdivisions. This panel will consider the revenue sharing program which comes up for renewal in 1980.

The regulations task force will be responsible for evaluating the economic and social effects of government regulations as well as the impact and effectiveness of various plans to limit government spending.

"I sought election to the Budget Committee because the overriding problem of inflation is going to face the president and the Congress to make some very difficult spending decisions during the next two years," he said.
