

## Botsford chief tapped for council

Gerson I. Cooper, vice president of administration at Botsford General Hospital in Farmington Hills, has been named a member at large of the statewide health coordinating council for a term of office through March, 1981.

In making the appointment, Governor William Milliken said in a letter to Cooper: "I have every confidence that you will derive personal satisfaction from your background and experience."

Milliken also said the council will serve as the cornerstone of a renewed alliance for health and "it is my hope that this council, with its broad representation of highly qualified individuals,

will provide the necessary direction for improving the quality of health care available to all our citizens at reasonable cost."

As a member of the 54 person council, Cooper will add valuable input to the development of an annual state health plan, the approval or disapproval of applications for federal health funds, and advise the governor, the legislature and the office of health and medical affairs on health planning and resources department.

Cooper is currently chairman of the board of the American Osteopathic Hospital Association and has served on

a variety of committees and task forces on the local, state, regional and national levels since 1967.

His first hospital based experience was with Ziegler Osteopathic Hospital in Detroit, where he progressed from business manager in 1959 to vice president for administration in 1970. In 1978, he was named vice president of administration at Botsford Hospital. A native Detroit, Cooper is a 1957 graduate of Wayne State University, where he received a degree in business administration. He is a veteran of the U.S. Air Force. He and his wife, Carol, and their three children, Eben, Adam, and Eden, live in West Bloomfield.
