**Pub Crawl begins** on Suds Express

The Pub Crawl is expected to appeal to "singles, couples, people in their 20s and on up, opera lovers and others (as it did last year)," according to Michigan Opera Theater "pub"licist Blanche Robinson.

One suggestion Michigan Opera The-ter makes is that crawlers view the evening as a progressive dinner, with an aperitif and appetizer at the first stop, entree at the second, and dessert and after-dinner drink at a third. A percentage from the food and drinks goes to the Michigan Opera Theater. Tablicts (at \$5) also are available in administration of the state of the participating pubs on the night of the Pub Crawl. Tag on the Pub Crawl, make advance reservations by calling the Music Hall box office at 983-3717 (both tickets and Tshirts can be charged with major credit cards). Last-minute plans can be accommodated for Pub Crawlers who just want to show up the night of the event and buy their buttons at the Music Hall one of the pubs.
