

U-M Union hosting Jazz Revisited Colloquium

Live jazz performances will highlight the ninth annual Jazz Revisited Colloquium Saturday at the University of Michigan Union. Jazz from 1919-1947 is the focus of the event, sponsored by the U-M radio station WUOM and the U-M Extension Service.

The music of Benny Goodman is emphasized this year in a program developed by Richard Watson and U-M Director of Broadcasting Hazen Schumacher.

"It's not a 'colloquium' in the academic sense of the word," says Schumacher. "There will be a lot more music than talk on the program. It's an opportunity for people interested in old jazz to enjoy a day of listening and informal discussion."

According to Schumacher, the program will appeal to both "the interested newcomer and the serious aficionado."

The Colloquium begins at 9:30 a.m. with lectures on the evolutionary stages in Goodman's career: "The Goodman Orchestra until 1935," "The Goodman Orchestra from 1935-1947," and "Goodman's Small Groups." Representative recordings from the U-M jazz collection will be played during the presentations.

Performances by area jazz artists will be featured during the afternoon session (2-5:30 p.m.). The concert will be broadcast live over WUOM-FM (91.7) in Ann Arbor.

The first of three groups scheduled to perform is soprano Joan Morris and pianist William Bolcom.

"Joan and Bill have been called the foremost interpreters of American popular song in the country today," says Schumacher. "We are delighted to have their participation."

Bolcom serves on the U-M School of Music faculty. Also from the School of Music will be James Dapogny, director of the University Jazz Ensemble. His seven-piece group will perform instrumental selections made popular by Goodman.

The concert concluded with an appearance by Misbehavin', featuring vocalists Jane Hassinger, Patty O'Connor and Kathy Rasmussen.

"Misbehavin' has revived the vocal style of the Andrews Sisters with modern adaptations of the old tunes," says Schumacher. "They'll sing numbers of Goodman, Fats Waller and other greats."

The day's activities conclude with the May edition of "Jazz Revisited Request Night," hosted by Schumacher.

The monthly program is broadcast live from the WUOM studios beginning at 8:05 p.m. Colloquium participants will be invited to request historic jazz recordings from the 12,000-disc collection at U-M.

Details on registration for the full day or the afternoon concert only are available from the U-M Extension Service (313) 764-5304. Participants may register at the door beginning at 8:30 a.m., May 12. Reduced student fees are available with identification.

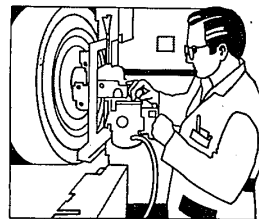
