Raiders finish 3rd in Lahser Relays

Brother Rice continued to show its domination in boys' track action, winning the rain-soaked 19-team Bloomfield Hills Lahser Relays last Saturday. The Warriors won the annual event with 42 points, Birmingham Groves placed a distant second with 30 points. North Farmington, considered by many to be an area powerhouse, placed third with 23 points, while the host Knights were fourth with 21 points. It was Lahser's best finish in its own event.

Royal Oak Dondro placed fifth with

20 points. Downriver threat Trenton was sixth with 14 points and Royal Oak finished seventh with 13. Dearborn Edsel Ford and Oak Park tied for eighth place with eight points each. Southfield-Lahser rounded out the top 10 with seven points. Other area teams saw Bloomfield Hills Andover, Farmington High and Farmington Harrison all tie for 13th place with three points apiece. Southfield High did not score. The top five finishers in each relay event received medals.

The Warriors won five of the 13 relay events, including two of the five field-event relays.

Rick Dutas, Mark Lytle and Jim Browne combined to place first in the discus relay with a total of 387.4. Jon English, Tom Finn and Rob LaRee combined to win the long jump relay in 57.54.

Rice also won the one-mile relay

with the foursome of LaRee, John Cunningham, Finn and Don Pietrowski combining for a 3:23.6 clocking. Finn, Brian Brennan, Cunningham and Pietrowski won the sprint medley relay in 3:35.4, and Brennan, LaRee, Browne and Ralph Caroline took the shuttle burdle in 59.5 seconds.

OCC stickers advance

Oakland Community College won its first Region 12 baseball championship Sunday with a 6-3 victory over Macomb Community College in the regional final in Cleveland.

OCC, which has a 25-9 overall record under veteran coach Dave Wenzel, advanced to district playoffs this weekend.

OCC whipped Macomb in the championship game thanks to some clutch pitching by Dave Tennant and Mark Martin. Tennant, a freshman lefthander from Clawson, worked 6 1/2 innings of relief, striking out three and walking one. Martin, a lefty from Rochester, pitched the eighth and ninth innings, fanning three of the last six batters. He was the only OCC player to make the All-Region 12 team.

tallied five times in the eighth. Earlier in the tournament, OCC stopped Macomb, 1-0, as freshman right-hander Dwayne Manning pitched a six-hitter. Manning, from Detroit Redford High, struck out five and lifted his record to 5-0 this season. Catcher Don Rohl singled home OCC's lone run in the first inning.

OCC started the tournament with a 4-2 victory over host Cuyahoga West, and then bested top-seeded Jackson Community College, 9-3. Wenzel's team pounded out 18 hits in the first two games. Wenzel, who has coached OCC's baseball team since the school opened 11 years ago, will take his squad into the district playoffs to face Triton College of Chicago at 1 p.m. Saturday. The site of the game has yet to be determined. Tiger Stadium or Oakland University are possibilities.
