Workshops offered

The Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association is offering several workshops during May and June as adjuncts to its regular class schedule.

In a two day session, May 24-25, Sergio DeGusthi will conduct a "Head Portrait Sculpture in Clay" workshop. Students will study the structure of a head and model it in clay. Then they will cast the head with plaster and hydrostone.

A felt-making workshop, taught by Susan Arol-Taylor, May 31-June 2, will feature the designing of a pattern for a felt sampler, the carding of wool fleece and the transformation of a six-inch pile of fluffed fleece into a finished piece of handmade felt.

Leslie Masters will teach "Color Problems for Painters" June 7, 8. This workshop will provide an intensive study of color as it applies to paint.

Starting with color theory and analysis, students will progress through the painting process, learn to use color relationships and complete several paintings. They are invited to bring in partially completed paintings for help in solving color problems.




