

Taking a walk through Troy

Although more than 300 youths have already signed up, the Troy Jaycees are hoping another 1,000 area youths will walk a 30 kilometer route through Troy to raise money for needy children.

Troy will host a Walk for Mankind June 2 to benefit Project Concern. The proceeds will be used for food and health care for needy children throughout the world. Walkers are asked to solicit pledges from friends, neighbors and relatives for each kilometer walked. The suggested pledge of 10 cents per kilometer could raise \$60 for a walker with 20 sponsors. Walkers won't have to collect the

pledges after the walk. All billings will be done by computer.

Youths can obtain entry forms, sponsor sheets and an iron-on decal by sending their name and address to Troy Jaycees, 1325 Keywest, Troy 48064.

The Troy walk is one of 12 slated for communities in southeast Michigan. Youths from Birmingham, Rochester and Avon Township are joining Troy walkers to raise money for Project Concern.

The route in Troy will start and end at Troy High School, 3170 Livonia north of Big Beaver. Registration will be from 7:30 to 9:30 a.m. The 18.6 mile route will wind

through Troy and is expected to take the average walker five hours to complete.

Local organizations will man the 15 checkpoints along the route, providing water, sun tan lotion, first aid and other items that might be needed by walkers. At the end of the walk, refreshments, food and entertainment is planned.

Those who can't make the entire route will be chauffeured back to the starting point in well marked Weary Walker Wagons. Youths will be cautioned against accepting rides from anyone except the volunteers, who will be wearing special arm bands.

Troy police helped map

out the route, most of which is on sidewalks. At some points, the walkers will be traveling on the shoulder of the road. Crossing guards will help

walkers cross busy roads. Walkers could raise as much as \$30,000 for Project Concern to be used in providing medical care, health care training

and self sufficiency programs for children in 80 countries, ranging from depressed areas of the United States to China, Mexico and Bolivia.

cal digs on the grounds of Mercy Center. Students divide into two groups and bury their cultural artifacts in an unmowed area behind the senior citizens building adjacent to the school at Eleven Mile and Middlebelt. They switch sites and dig up the goods.

"They learn archeology isn't a treasure hunt," she said. "They learn about culture and civilization."

"Digs are a slow process. Artifacts must be removed carefully. Everything must be sifted, marked, bagged and tagged."

Sister is a graduate of Western Michigan University, the University of

Michigan, and St. Louis University where she earned bachelor's, masters, and doctorate degrees in Latin with minors in Greek and archeology.

After her year's sabbatical, she will return to Mercy High to coordinate an alumni department — a job that will require more digging, this time, into student records.

"I have already begun to compile a list of addresses of former students," she said.
