THE CENTRAL Volunteer Bureau of the United Community Services has issued a detailed list of agencies needing some help at Christmas and providing ideas for gifts or parties. Included on the metropolitan area list are more than 40 institutions and agencies in Wayne and Macomb Counties. Some of them are close to or in Observerville. These are:

THE ARNOLD HOME, a residence for the elderly, needs a volunteer to serve as Santa Claus along with small gifts for residents without relatives. Mrs. Jane Devereaux at PA 2-3055 can tell you about the needs of the Easter Seal Society of Western Wayne County. This agency provides services for physically handicapped children and adults.

Some of the items needed include: wheelchairs and walkers; crafts storage shelves or cabinets; special playing cards—holders for the disabled; stainless steel teaspoons and serving spoons; a 24 to 30 cup coffee maker; a microphone; table games; playing cards; and crafts materials.

Nightingale West, Inc., a nursing center for adult and elderly patients, would welcome caroling and song fests or visits by groups of young people. The home also needs decorations and small favors, along with funds to purchase clothing for needy patients.

A bread made from mashed sprouted grain rather than flour is featured in the Zerbo's Health Foods, 3416 Plymouth, Livonia.

The special process, says store owner Henry Zerbo, makes this bread easier to digest and more nutritious than other varieties of the staff of life.

"Sprouted seeds provide far better nourishment than ground flour," Zerbo said. "The grain used for this brand of bread is sprouted for 24 hours."

Zerbo's store carries the bread in three varieties: wheat, rye and seven-grain. The 1-1/2 pound loaves are lower in calories than standard bread and "the cheapest food on the market when you consider nutrition," Zerbo said.

Zerbo wholesales the bread from the Cybus Co. of Wauke-

sha, Wis., a family owned business that operates from 9 a.m. to midnight, baking each day's supply.

The grain is grown organically with no chemical sprays used, Zerbo said. It takes only two days to ship from Wisconsin to Livonia.
