Costs of county roads are shared by three parties

Much perspiration.

That's what it took, but it seems to be paying off as a \$1.5 million tri-party road construction program gets "on the ground".

Projects are being let to bidders now and are expeacted to be completed this year on county roads in 38 communities, said Fred Houghten, chairman of the board of Oakland County Road

HE SAID the necessary overall approval has been received from the Oakmonthly bear of Commissioners, which land the Part of Commissioners, which land the Part of Commissioners which land the Part of Commission is matching to contributing \$500,000.

The road commission is matching the county board's share. Cities, villages and townships in which projects are being conducted are contributing onethird also.

The tri-party program projects are in addition to the other \$17 million worth of construction the road commission has programed for this year. That work involves \$6.3 million of local tax money and \$5.3 million of federal tax money and \$5.3 million of federal tax money.

money and \$5.3 million of federal tax money, "Unlike most projects, which we plan several years in advance and are negotiating with local communities and the several years in advance, the county board assisted projects are always last minute, \$5 mid Houghten. Rather than relatively simple two-party greements, hey require three-party coordination. Also, last year was the first time the county board required us to seek participation by cities and villages. It's surprising so many cities are participating, because the projects must be on county roads due to restrictions imposed by state law on use of the road commission's share of state-collected gas and weight taxes. collected gas and weight taxes."

"As finally worked out, the program includes projects in 20 of 26 cities, one includes projects in 20 of 26 cities, one of 12 villages and 18 of 23 townships," 'said Houghten.

Eight district court judges failed again last week to get a 10 percent raise from the Oakland County Board of Commissioners.

The eight judges of the 52nd district, including those presiding in the cities of Troy and Rochester, are paid \$42,586 annually - \$27,765 from the state and \$14,395 from the county.
The board's personnel committee that recommended the county increase its portion of the judges' salaries 10 percent to \$16,652.

But the finance committee said it lacked money for the raises and recommended against the increase.

Before the full 27-member board of commissioners, the proposal last week fell one vote short of the 14 needed for approval.

Judges in the 52nd District include Robert L. Shipper and Mildred A. Vlaich in Rochester and William E. Bolle, James R. Hand and Bristol E. Hunter in Troy.

STATE LAW allows the county to pay the judges up to \$18,510. The district judges last fail asked for a 38 percent increase to that amount last fail. But the board granted a 9 percent raise to \$14,539 when approving the county budget last December A propos-
