

Catholic Central tops Stevenson in pre-district

DETROIT CATHOLIC CENTRAL scored one run in the first inning and it held up for a 1-0 victory over Livonia Stevenson Monday in a state tournament pre-qualifying baseball game.

The Shamrocks produced their run on a single by Chris Sabo, a walk to Rob Williamson and an error by first baseman Dave Krall on a groundball hit by Joe Chops.

Craig Herberholz was the winning pitcher. He gave up three hits, struck

out six and walked one. Mickey Shims, the losing hurler, relinquished four hits, struck out two and issued three walks.

Both are right-handers and both went the distance.

The Spartans had several scoring opportunities the best of which came in the second inning when they loaded the bases with none out. However, they just couldn't get a runner across the plate.

Sabo belted a triple in addition to his single for the Shamrocks.

Stevenson committed three errors during the battle, CC two.

"It was a superbly pitched game," summarized Larry Russas, coach of the Spartans.

EARLIER, Stevenson played over five errors to defeat Highland Park in a non-league game, 9-6.

Craig Beyrand, who relieved Jim Harkrader in the second inning, gained the pitching victory.

Krall collected three RBIs with a pair of singles. Beyrand punched a double and a single. Tom Finn smashed a two-run home run.

The Spartans last week also were on the short end of a 2-1 score against Waterford. However, the game will be replayed with the score tied at 2-2 in the seventh inning as the result of a Stevenson protest about a faulty rules interpretation being upheld.

CLARENCEVILLE took a bitter 3-2 loss from Oak Park in a Metro West Conference game.

The Trojans out-hit their opponent, 9-3, but Jim Beyer's pitching difficulties in the first inning could not be overcome.

The Redskins scored all three of their runs on three infield singles and three walks their first time at bat.

The Trojans notched single runs in the fourth and fifth innings.

Wayne Rankin, Jeff Nabozny, Jim McPhail and Beyer all singled twice for Clarenceville.

Beyer walked 11 during the game and struck out one.

Earlier, the Trojans rapped Dearborn Heights Annapolis, 8-1, for their first league win.

Nabozny was the winning pitcher.

Jim Parent and Nabozny each went 3-3 at the plate. Parent hit a solo home run.

The two wins gave the Lakers a 16-4 overall record. They finished their conference with a 9-1 mark.

The team's next contest will be a state pre-district game at Birmingham Seaholm on Friday. Game time is 4 p.m.
