## OU team asks for help

Your knowledge of historical data or your collection of historical artifacts is exactly what a team of researchers at Oakland University is after.

Richard Stamps, an OU anthropologist, John Cameron, chairman of the UD epartemnt of Art and Art History, and Richard Zurel, an archeaology research associate at OU, have been awarded, a grant through the federal government to document all the historical sites within Oakland County.

Because the project is so massive—it is part of a national effort to document all troids and the project his part of a national effort to document historical sites and buildings—

the team is asking for assistance from the people who the land the best: the people who live there.

Questionnaires are being distributed through the OU Laboratory of Archae-ology. The forms ask for people to help them pinpoint possible historical mate-rials or sites.
