In the Con A test, cells from the breast cancers are grown in tissue cul-ture and then treated with Con A, as substance derived from Jack Bean Seeds. How much reaction occurs is de-tected by using red blood cells, which also react with Con A and stick to the I umor cells.

The MCP scientists have found that cells from different human breast can-cers react different with Con A. How with they react is related to the prob-bush that the patient's cancer will

"Of course, this isn't yet a test that:
can be routinely used on all patients. But we are working hard to make it so," said Rich.
"Until that time, the Con A test will assist laboratory researchers in assessing the differences among cancer cells and their relationship to the behavior of the tumor."


