Appointing new OCC treasurer stirs board debate

At most colleges, the role of treasurer is largely ceremonial and largely uncontroversial.

Not at Oakland Community College. The OCC board last week found itself unable to make a decision after a long discussion that ranged into the ethics of college officials making contributions to legislators.

The decision on appointment of a treasurer was put off two weeks until OCC can study how other colleges handle it.

THE DISCUSSION began innocently enough. President Robert Roelofs said W.H. Nikkel had submitted his resignation as treasurer, effective July 1, and Roelofs was recommending Anthony D. Janson as his replacement.

Roelofs said Nikkel would retain his post of vice president for business and financial affairs, including responsibility for OCC's physical plant, and take on two new duties: fund-raising among alumni and "spending more time in Lansing."

Janson would continue as controller and take on the additional function of treasurer, under Roelofs' recommendation.

The juggling of duties puzzled some board members.

The treasurer's duties, Roelofs said, are to certify the tax levy, manage the \$49 million investment portfolio and "make certain income and revenue are accounted for according to board policy."

TRUSTEE Barbara Willing pointed out that "other colleges have a board member as treasurer," notably Schoolcraft and Macomb. "I have a lot of problems with this (recommendation)," she added.

Trustee Gordon Henderson had no problems. "I was treasurer for six months. It (the job) had very little personal input from me. They use a facsimile signature for signing checks. Rather than have a board member be a figurehead treasurer, these offices (secretary and treasurer) should be full-time (college) employees."

"The secretary and treasurer in local (K-12) boards are somewhat ceremonial figures," added Chairwoman Lila R. Johnson.

THE CONVERSATION got political after Miss Willing asked what salary arrangements would be made for Nikkel and Janson if the treasurer's job were shifted.

"I had not intended to talk on it," said Roelofs, but he did. Nikkel was due for a \$24 percent increase, the same as other administrators, which would amount to \$3,300. Nikkel would actually take \$1,000 of it because "there are some expenses with the Lansing work," and Janson would take the remaining \$2,300.

What expenses? someone asked.

"Expenses in excess of our per diem allowance," said Roelofs, citing parties, affairs and fund-raisers.

Mrs. Johnson didn't like that kind of talk. "How do we determine which legislators we support?" she asked.

"It's judgmental," Roelofs answered. He cited fund-raisers by key legislators on committees, legislators within the OCC district.

Trustee Earl Anderson backed Roelofs: "As politicians, we've got to understand what the hell the ballgame is. You don't make contributions to politicians who won't help you."

"I understand what the hell the ballgame is," Mrs. Johnson Johnson said. "I just don't like playing it."

"If you're suspicious," said Roelofs, "we'll work on gaining your confidence."
