

Teen Center opens doors on June 27

The Farmington Teen Center will offer area youths a wide variety of activities and field trips this summer. The center, following a successful first summer in 1978, will be open from June 27 until August 17.

The center is located at William Grace Elementary School on Shiloh between Inkster Road and Middlebelt.

All Farmington area teens, ages 13-18, are welcome to take part in the center program. The center will be open Monday through Friday from 4-6 p.m. and 7-10 p.m. with Tuesdays set aside for field trips. All teens, however, must have a signed permission slip to take part in the activities.

Jerry Young, a history teacher and coach at Farmington High School, will be the director of the center again this year. Working with Young will be two adult assistant directors and two student leaders. Young said that many of last year's popular field trips will be repeated.

"We'll be going to the zoo, a Tiger baseball game, spend a day in Detroit, canoeing, roller skating, go to Kensington Park, the wavepool and to an Express soccer game," he said.

There will be parties, arts and crafts, macramé, tie dyeing, basketball and softball games.

"The center is organized on a drop-in basis. Teens can feel free to come by and listen to music, talk or have pop," he said.

Equipment for the center, such as pool or air hockey tables and pinball machines is mainly on loan from people in the community. Young stressed that the center really needs loans of this type of equipment. Anyone wishing to lend something can contact Young at 476-4120.

The Farmington Teen Center, operated by Farmington Youth Assistance, is financed by the United Community Services and by the cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills.

The center had a successful initial run last summer as many teens took part in the activities and field trips. All of the participants enjoyed having the center open as a place to go and expressed their desire for the center to be open again. Young hopes for an even better turnout this year.
