Getting the kids off to camp

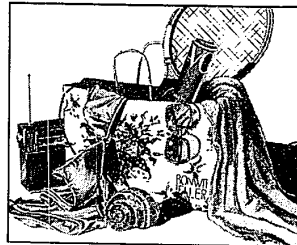

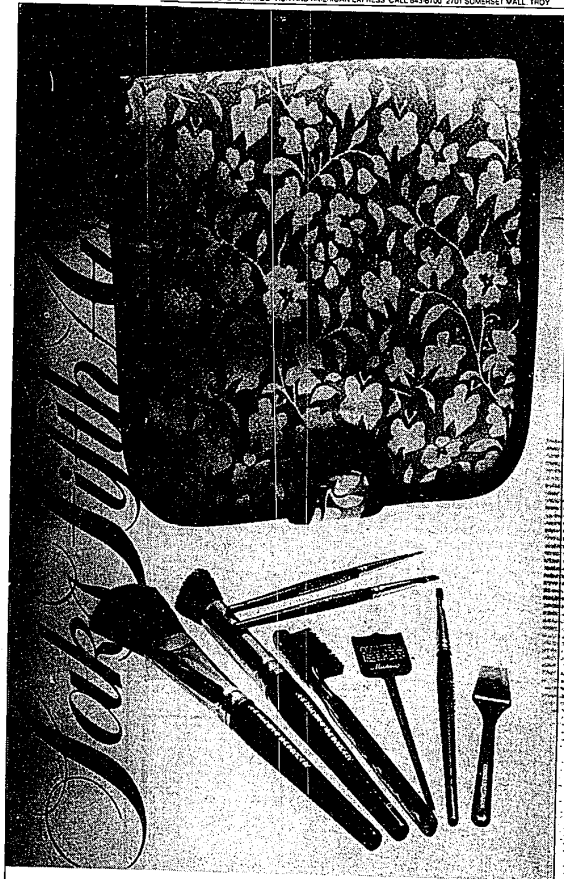
