"We're really strong on defense," she said. "It really feels good when you get them out 1-2-3 and that's what we've been doing lately."

"We need the same kind of defense we had last weekend," said Shelly McCaman, shortstop. "We talk to each other in the field and make sure everyone knows what's going on before we pitch to the batter."

"Experience-wise, we're better and I think we have a lot better chance," she said.

Sharon Laird, first baseman and the only freshman in the starting lineup, summarized her experiences during her first season.

"We have a lot of fun. We're all friends. We're never arguing and everyone is working together and helping each other out," she said.

All week, the Trojans have been working at hitting fast pitching with an automatic pitching machine. They have also been constantly practicing fielding. And, it appears, they've been having fun.
