Library summer agenda set for young adults

Just about this time, kids everywhere are humming the tune of an old rock 'n' roll hit. "School's out for summer" has become the theme song for those waiting out that last day of school. The bell rings and at last, summer vacation is here.

But with it comes the threat of boredom. If you're worried about out how to pass the time during those long vacation weeks, perhaps the Farmington Hills Branch Library can help. In July the Young Adult Department will sponsor several popular interest programs on Monday afternoons. Each session will feature a different hobby or skill, led by a guest speaker. The programs are open to all interested, so check out their wide range of offerings and see what adventure appeals to you.

Photography will begin on Monday, July 16, 2-4 p.m. A professional photo-

grapher from Focal Point Studio of Photography in Farmington will demonstrate the fine points of photography. Bring your own camera and learn how to get great photos.

On Monday, July 9, from 2-4 p.m., learn macrame from an expert from the "This n' That Shop" in Farmington. Everyone who attends will have the opportunity to make their own keychain.

Note: This program requires advance registration beginning June 22, and a \$1 fee for the macrame materials. (This is the only program of these four that will require registration.)

The game Dungeons and Dragons will be taught on Monday, July 23, 2-4 p.m. A guest speaker from Joe's Hobby Center will bring game-playing equipment and demonstrate how to play this fascinating adventure game. All who attend will have an opportunity to participate.

Fossil Hunting will be introduced to those interested on Monday, July 30, 2-4 p.m. Mrs. Ruth Chlaman, noted author and expert paleontologist, will show her beautiful collection of fossils and will explain how to search for fossils in nearby locations in Northern Michigan and Canada. A question and answer period and a feature film on fossils will also highlight the program.

Due to overwhelming response, the Farmington Branch Library will again offer the four-week babysitting class. The class will be taught by certified American National Red Cross instructors and is open to all 11 to 15-year-olds interested in learning simple techniques and skills they might be expected to know when caring for children. The class will meet on Wednesdays, July 11 through Aug. 1, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

Participants will receive certification by the American National Red Cross after they have attended all four meetings.

The Young Adult Department will sponsor a feature program on the well-known author, J.R.R. Tolkien, on Tuesday, July 17, from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Farmington Hills Branch Library. This program, open to all, will feature guest speakers from the American Tolkien Society, an organization dedicated to the study and appreciation of the works of J.R.R. Tolkien.

A slide presentation of Tolkien-related art will be highlighted and rare and unique Tolkien books and publications will be displayed. After the presentation, the speakers will be available for a question and answer period.
