

Artists leads national group

Patricia Hill Burnett, Detroit artist and women's rights leader, was elected president of the National Association of Commissioners for Women (NACW) at its annual convention in Providence, Rhode Island, June 9.

NACW is in a key position among the national women's organizations because it is frequently consulted by the White House on women's issues and testifies in almost all legislation concerning women.

Ms. Burnett said in her acceptance speech to the representatives of mem-

ber commissions on the status of women from all 50 states, who voted for her to be their top officer for the next term. "The recession and tax revolt has brought tremendous cutbacks in state funds. First to be reduced or eliminated are women's commissions because they have not yet found a way to unite their voices in protest."

She added, "Our main goal this year must be to counter the backlash against women's commissions across the country, in order to unify the women in every state to work for passage of

the Equal Rights Amendment, as a first step towards real equality."

Since 1971 Governor William Milliken has regularly appointed her to the Women's Commission, during which she served two terms as chairman. She founded the first chapter of the National Organization for Women in Michigan in 1969 and served on the national board of NOW for five years.

That's neighborhood interest...involved individuals helping Farmington to be an interesting place to live in.

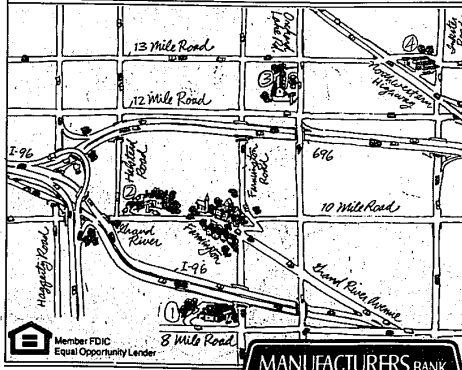
