# **Oakland** politicians scrutinize Wayne's overhaul

As the Michigan Legislature tackies Wayne County reorganization, Oakland County officials will be keeping their ears to the ground for possible repercussions.

IT COULD mean a stronger posi-tion for the state's first elected county executive, Oakland's Daniel Murphy, a Republican. According to Patrick Nowak, Murphy's aid for intergovernmental relations, the "spin off" of a Wayne county executive "will be recept tion of the need for a strong execu-tive form of government." Nowak said Murphy agrees with Gov. William Milliken that a strong er county executive is synonymous

Milliken has asked for changing state law to allow a stronger county executive, Nowak said, but so far the Democratic-controlled legislature has resisted.

According to one Detroit area state representative state law doesn't allow the executive to be much more than "a glorified clerk and records keeper."

Stronger executive powers would not only increase Murphy's authroi-ty within county government but also in lobbying Lansing for state tax dollars. The only other county with an executive is Bay County.

SINCE HE TOOK office in January 1975, Murphy's authority has been in dispute among the Board of Commissioners, prosecutor's office, drain commissioner and road commissioner and

A stronger executive will likely be pushed by Milliken and House and Senate Republicans as part of the Wayne reorganization issue. Milliken has said he sees no way out of the Wayne's financial woe except through unified county government under a strong executive.

Detroit Democrats in the legisla-ture are expected to oppose a coun-ty executive, fearing it would gen-erate competition with the mayor of Detroit for state aid.

pay for the election. The charter commission would draft a county charter, similar to a city home rule charter, subject to voter approval, within the guidelines the state mandates. Wayne would thus become the first charter county in Michigan.

WHETHER the county has an elected county executive supported by western Wayne and Downriver commissioners, or an appointed county manager supported by Detroit commissioners, depends on what options the charter commis-

sion has under state law.

The county home rule act, now only gives a charter commission the option to recommend a county executive, which Milliken and the epublicans support. They will likely be joined by Democratic legislar from western Wayne districts.

Suburan commissioners are circulating petitions favoring an elected county executive. They reportedly have \$4,000 signatures.
