## JACQUELINE ANNE HACKER

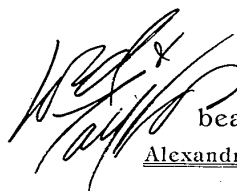
Miss Hacker, 12, died on June 14 when the mini-bike she was riding collided with a truck.

## Library offers summer features

That familiar summer refrain "what's there to do" could be absent from your household by taking advantage of programs offered for children through the Farmington Community Library system.

In a creative dramatics program, four- and five-year-olds are invited to use their abilities to experience new adventures by becoming characters in books found at the library.

Registration is presently going on for this program.

The classes will be in the Farmington Hills Library July 10 and 24, from 10:30-11:15 a.m. The Farmington branch will have the program July 11 and 25 from 2-2:45 p.m.

Children are also welcome to participate in the "Kids are Super Heroes" program. Pre-schoolers will be able to join in one-half hour of fun hearing stories and seeing films about child heroes in literature.

After viewing the films, participants will, through song and finger play, see that children are heroes today, too. A hero memento will be awarded to each child who attends this program.

The Farmington branch will sponsor the program on Thursday, July 5 from 2-2:30 p.m. The Hills branch will have it on Friday, July 6, from 10:30-11 p.m.

Two movies about super kids, "Harold's Fairy Tale" and "Little Hiawatha" will lead to creation of a hero ring and bracelet.

This program will be at the Hills Library on July 19, from 2-2:30 p.m. and at the city branch on July 20 from 10:30-11 a.m.

"Time for Theater" will be presented by this summer's young adult volunteers. The plays will be presented at the city branch on August 2, from 2-2:30 p.m. and at the Hills branch from 10:30-11 a.m. on August 3.

Young readers who are now finishing 4th, 5th, and 6th grades are invited to join in informal discussions of popular books. Group members will purchase paperback copies of "Matt Gargan's Boy," "A Gift of Magic," and "The House with the Clock in its Walls" for \$3 at the time of registration which is presently in progress.

The sessions will be at the Hills Library on July 11 and July 25, from 2-3 p.m. The city branch will sponsor the program on July 12 and July 26, from 2-3 p.m.

"Yankee Doodle Doings" will celebrate the 4th of July with the patriotic adventures of "Yankee Doodle Crick," "Ben and Me," and "Johnny Tremain."

The Hills branch will sponsor the program on July 5 from 10-11:30 a.m. The city branch will have the program on July 3, from 2-3:30 p.m.

"Super Heroes Extravaganza" will feature films about favorite comic heroes. Participants are asked to bring

their favorite comic books which they would like to swap with other children attending the program. Bring only comic books with covers. Participants will receive a free comic book.

Times for this program are 10:30-11:30 a.m. on July 12 at the city branch and 2-3 p.m. on July 10 for the Hills branch.

Enjoy the transition of a young boy, Wart, to Arthur King of England in the filmstrip "Sword in Stone." Dazzling Dan the Magical Man of Farmington Hills, will be the MC of the hour as he performs feats of magic.

The Hills magic hour will be from 10:30-11:30 a.m. on July 19. The city magic hour will be on July 17, from 2-3 p.m.

"Summertime Shivers" will give participants a chance to join in an afternoon of haunting fun and supernatural experience. They will see "Ghost of a Chance" and "Cosmic Awareness of Duffy Moon."

The Hills will sponsor the program on July 24, from 2-3:30 p.m. City branch time will be from 10-11:30 a.m. on July 26.

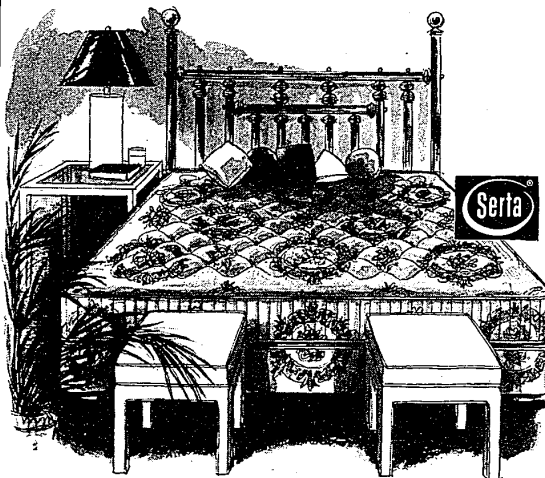

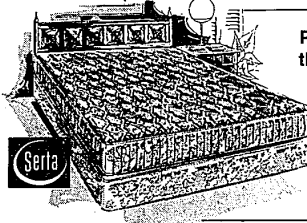
