

# Live Y'ers a shock in Toledo

Four swimmers from the Oakland Live Yers Swim Team were among 874 competitors from five states and Canada at the Greater Toledo 13 Strong Summer Invitational last week. It was a long course (50-meter) outdoor invitational.

Sherie Fedak, competing in the 11-12 age group, came in second in the 100-meter breaststroke with a meet record time of 1:25.12. She also placed fourth in the 100-meter backstroke, fifth in the 200-IM (2:49.8) and seventh in the

200-free (2:30.26).  
 Missy Proctor, 14 years old, swam the long course for the first time and placed eighth in the 50-free with a time of 0:30.98. She took 12th in the 100 back with a 1:19.74, and 11th in the 100-free in 1:07.8.

Jayne Warnica registered her best time in the 400-meter free, a 5:21.90. She had an improved time of 20:40.2 in the 1500-meter race.

Allison Reed also participated for the Live Yers.

Rochester resident Jim Bruzesse swam for another club.

Swimming at the Michigan Junior Olympic Swim Meet A-B at Brennan Pool in Detroit was Tom Warnica, Kathy Kubicki, Sherrie Roberts and Amy Proctor.

Warnica was second in the 100-free (1:13.03), fourth in the 50 breast (0:44.16), fourth in the 200 free (2:37.74), and fifth in the 50 free (0:33.17).

Kubicki placed seventh in the 100 breast with a 1:41.93, and eighth in the 50 breast with a 0:46.15. Roberts improved her times in five events, and placed fifth overall in her 200-IM with a 3:10.4.

Proctor swam in two events.

**LIVE YER Fedak also participated**

In the recent sixth annual Cincinnati Pepsi Martin Invitational Swim Meet, Fedak, 12 years old, made it to the championship finals in the 100-meter breaststroke and took third place. Her time was 1:24.76.

She also took sixth in the 200-meter IM with a 2:44.5 — six seconds faster than her best time ever. During the three-day meet she swam the 100-meter fly, 200-meter free, 50 free, 100 free and 100-meter backstroke.

Some of the top swimmers from California to Massachusetts competed in the meet. All totaled there were 41 teams and 554 swimmers representing 18 states.

The Oakland Live Yers will be swimming at Southfield each morning from 7:30 to 9 p.m., training for the Michigan State AAU championships in August.

## WB softball races tight

Supreme Siding and Peterson Glass each posted a pair of victories to remain tied for the Men's Division I lead in the West Bloomfield Community Education softball league.

### Lake Fleming

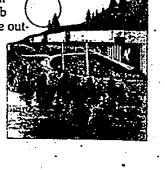

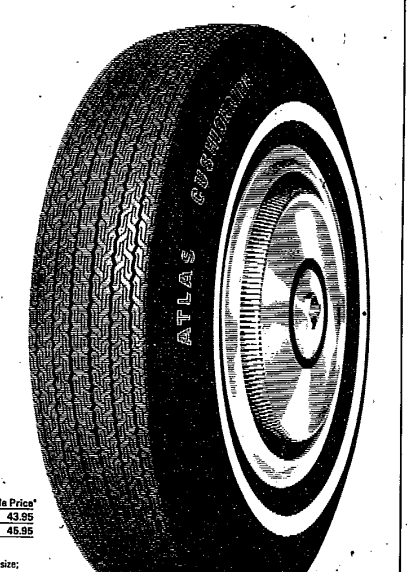
