West Bloomfield pair wins SEMTA qualifiers

Keith Sotiroff, a freshman at Detroit Country Day, won the Southeast Michigan Tennis Association (SEMTA) qualifier for 14-year-old boys held recently at Oakland University.

Sotiroff defeated Eric Hottley 6-3, 6-2.

The win qualifies Sotiroff for the Westerns, a tournament which will involve players from Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, West Virginia, Kentucky and Ohio.

Brother Ed Nagel won the SEMTA qualifier for 16-year-old boys, defeating Chris Robbins 6-4, 3-8, 6-3 at Farwell Field in Detroit. It was the third consecutive year that Nagel has won his age grouping.

To gain the honor he averaged 208 and won 10 of his 12 matches.

Another unusual performance was that of DeLores Hareath. She had the misfortune to register 11 splits in her three games.

The pacesetter for the day was Sue Schueher with a 268 in 588. Behind her came Jane Mokosi with 565 and Betty Woodstock with 541. Next in line was Sue Berry with a 214 in 528.

In the men's league Gordon Liddy, a 190 bowler, came through with a 277 and Tom Bowen turned in a four-game series of 846 on games of 236, 213, 225 and 174.

In the Kings and Queens league, John Teslak had a 679 and Enie Teslak had a 534. In the Saturday morning youth league Bill Meister showed the way with a 600.

AT GARDEN LANES Ann Furnaga showed the way in the ladies summer league with a 573. Meanwhile, Jean Puwoward and

Jean Tresky tied at 532 for runner-up honors.

WHEN THE FIRING ended in the Champion of Champions preliminaries last Sunday night at Plaza Lanes, the Dearborn-Schafer team, captained by Tony Manette, was in first place with a count of 3111. The team now will move on to the finals later in the month.
