

All-Area girls golf team is an 'under par' group

Golfers from the Rochester and Troy areas dominated the girls' All-Area and Eccentric area honor squad, as selected by area golf coaches.

Three golfers from the Rochester area, two from Troy schools and one from the Birmingham-Bloomfield area combine to make the six-member first-team squad. Two more Rochester area golfers and two each from Birmingham-Martin and Bloomfield Hills Kingswood make up the second team.

Schools from the Southfield, Farmington and West Bloomfield areas do not compete in girls' golf.

Rochester High School, fourth-place finishers at the Grand Blanc Regional in May, landed two

girls on the first-team squad. State qualifier Rochester Adams, third-place finishers at Grand Blanc, placed one girl on the first team. One girl each from Kingswood, Troy High School and Troy Athens round out the top golf squad.

Two golfers, Adams' Jolayne Johnston and Kingswood's Barbara Gibbons, were unanimous selections from the coaches who participated in the voting.

Johnston was one of the top golfers in the regional, shooting a score of 95. The tough, consistent competitor has been Adams' low scorer the past two years.

Gibbons is recognized as one of the finest golfers in the area, although injuries prevented her

from participating in many of the dual matches this season. Nonetheless, Gibbons shot an impressive 94 at regional competition.

Rochester High's Sue McColgan also received high praise from area coaches. An excellent all-around athlete in volleyball and basketball, as well as golf, McColgan had a below-average regional, shooting 100, but was quite consistent throughout the season.

Marilyn Tatters was Troy Athens' top golfer this spring, although this was only her first year as a full-time golfer. Also an all-around excellent athlete, Tatters shot a 97 at regionals and has great golfing potential.

Rochester High's Sheryl Walden joins her teammate McColgan on the first team. She shot a

99 at the regionals. The last member of the first team is Troy High's Arlene Romanski. Only a freshman, Romanski showed remarkable consistency and a good attitude all season. She shot in the high 40s most of the dual-match season at the tough Sylvan Glen golf course and capped the season with 100 at the regionals.

Coch-of-the-Year honors go to Rochester Adams' Linore Talley. A long-time coach at Adams, Talley led her fine squad to the state championships with that fine third-place finish in regionals. Adams was the top regional performer of all the girls' golf squads this spring.

SECOND TEAM

Rochester Adams' Becky Johnson heads the second-team selections. She hits the ball well but lacks distance and strength to be a low scorer, although the potential is there. She shot a 105 at the regionals.

Rochester High's Tara Stout played behind McColgan and Walden most of the year on the balanced squad. She shot a 101 at the regionals. Birmingham Mariah's Martha Christianson and Tam Bentley, the squad's two top golfers all spring, also earned second-team honors. Mariah finished fifth in the regionals thanks to these two girls. Christianson lacked consistency at times, but shot a solid 101 at the regional. Bentley scored behind Christianson most of the season. She shot a 103 in the regionals.

Bloomfield Hills Kingswood's Heidi Olson and Amy Honer round out the second-team selections. Olson was usually the top Aardvark golfer during the dual-match season when Gibbons was injured. Honer was right behind Olson in scoring, although she beat Olson, 104-108, in the regionals.

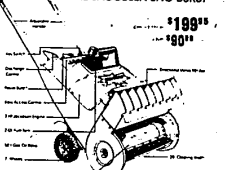

CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor Richard L. Tupper on June 18, 1979 in the Council Chambers, 35500 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

PRESIDENT: Mayor Tupper, Councilmen Bennett, Buckler, Hartsock, and Yoder. **CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT:** City Mgr. Deasman, Director Billing, Director Byrnes, Attorney Kelly and City Clerk Viane.

The minutes of previous meetings were approved, as corrected. The minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Permission was granted to the Huron River Hunting and Fishing Club to erect a tent for their Annual Lobster and Clam Party.

Council was advised of the invitation from the Farmington Founders Festival Committee to participate in the annual Parade on Saturday, July 23, 1979.

Letter from Mayor E. McNamara, City of Livonia, regarding update on suburban communities litigation against Detroit water rate increases was received and filed.

Permission was granted to the Farmington Center Company for use of the Ten Mile School/4th District Court Parking Lot during the Founders Festival.

Council received the resolution from West Bloomfield Township regarding control of motorboat speed and noise emission on inland lakes of less than 1300 acres.

Council approved resolution of the City of Northville opposing House Bill 4272. Council received proposals for Advanced Life Support Services from the Am-Care, Inc. and the Farmington City Ambulance.

Council authorized the City Manager to enter into a monthly lease agreement with Keep Michigan Beautiful, Inc.

Council awarded contract for the rehabilitation of housing to Tru-Craft Construction Company, 12500 W. Twelve Mile Rd., Southfield.

A Special Meeting of the City Council was established for 7:30 June 27, 1979 to award the bid for the city's \$1,000,000 Water Improvement Bonds.

Council authorized second estimated payment to ERG, Inc. of Ann Arbor, in the amount of \$5,017.13. Comments were heard from William McShane and JoAnne McShane, 33808 Glenview Ct.

The following financial reports were received and filed: General Fund, 11 mos. ended 5/31/79; 4th District Court, 11 mos. ended 5/31/79.

The following appointments were made: Farmington Building Authority-3 year term ending June, 1982; Mr. Clarence Shewbridge; Farmington Employees Retirement Board of Trustees-3 year term ending June, 1982; Mr. Harry Lapham.

The following ordinance was adopted: **ORDINANCE NO. C-455-79**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON BY ADDING NEW SECTIONS 12.1 THROUGH 12.6 TO THE UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE FOR CITIES, VILLAGES AND TOWNSHIPS, AS SET FORTH IN CHAPTER 105 TITLES OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDINANCES:
12.01. The following regulations shall prohibit parking in designated handicapped parking spots, except as permitted by statute or local ordinance.

12.1 Farmington Shopping Center
(a) all parking areas designated for handicapped parking only in the area bounded by Grand River, Farmington Road and Grove Street.

12.2 Bel Aire Plaza
(a) all parking areas designated for handicapped parking only in the area bounded by Leelanau, Orchard Lake Rd. and Ten Mile Road.

12.3 Farmington Town Shopping Center
(a) all parking areas designated for handicapped parking only in the area located in the southeast corner of Grand River and Halstead Road.

12.4 World Wide Shopping Center
(a) all parking areas designated for handicapped parking only in the area located in the southwest corner of Grand River and Whittaker.

12.5 Drakeville Shopping Center
(a) all parking areas designated for handicapped parking only in the area located in the southeast corner of Grand River Avenue and Drake Road.

12.6 Farmington Plaza
(a) All parking areas designated for handicapped parking only in the area located in the southeast corner of Grand River and Knoxy Street.

This ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the Farmington City Council on June 4, 1979, was adopted and enacted at the next regular meeting on June 18, 1979, and will become effective ten days after publication.
