The extent of toxic contamination and new pollution problems in the Great Lakes Basin will be reported at the three-day Great Lakes Water Quality Meeting of the International Joint Commission, July 9-11 at the Detroit Plaza Hotel, Renaissance Center.

The IJC, consisting of three Canadians and three Americans, is responsible for monitoring water quality cleanup efforts under the 1978 Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement.
