Jazz at DIA on radio

Sept. 22: "La Juive" by Halévy. Sept. 29: "La Sonnambula" by Bellini.

Bus rides available to parks

SEMTA and the Detroit Department of Transportation are providing bus service to five area Metroparks, Belle Isle and the Detroit Zoo. The special summer bus service will be available through Oct. 31. The buses will be in operation weekdays between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m., and 6 p.m.; weekends between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. Roundtrip fare for bus service to any of the Metroparks, Belle Isle or the Detroit Zoo is \$1.10 per person, prepaid, and \$1.25, in cash, per person if paid the day of the trip. Five area Metroparks — Metropoli-

tan Beach, Kensington Park, Lower Huron Park, Stoney Creek Park and Willow Park — offer a range of activities including biking, hiking, sports, swimming, picnic areas and nature trails. Group admission rates to the Detroit Zoo are available Monday through Friday at \$14 per bus.

The special summer bus service is designed to be used by groups. For service, a group representative is asked to call a central dispatch number to make a trip request. The dispatcher needs to know the preferred destination, the number of people making the trip, the preferred pick up and delivery time and the preferred date. A minimum of 25 individuals is required for a trip to be scheduled. Groups or individuals should expect to share a bus with other groups going to the same destination. Groups requesting the service are asked to call in advance, 48 hours in advance for weekday outings. If the trip begins in Detroit, call the Detroit Department of Transportation at 224-1550. If the trip begins in the suburbs, call SEMTA at 362-1160 or 362-1161.

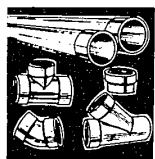

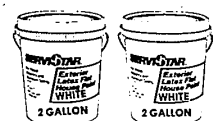
