Glick will discuss the development of his art and display samples of his ceramics, accompanied by a showing of the film "John Glick: An Artist and His Work," one of this year's winners at the American Film Festival.

He is former president of the state bar of Michigan and former co-chairman of the Judicial Qualifications Committee of the State Bar. He has served as a Democratic commissioner on the Employment Relations Commission since 1973.

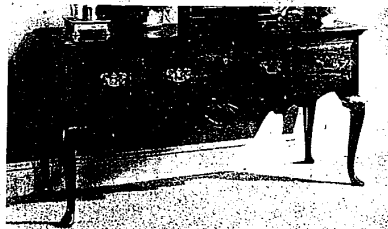
