'Art is truest League of Nations'

Joan Mondale, second lady of our land, proved to a large audience Friday that she is second to none in the realm

Mrs. Mondale came to Detroit to participate in the Detroit-Windsor In-ternational Freedom Festival as the principal speaker at the annual Women's Friendship luncheon.

Friday's event was: the 21st such luncheon and with Mrs.Mondale as a drawing card, it proved the largest to date. Well over 600 celebrants took part in the festive occasion.

Inside, Mrs. Mondale visited quietly during lunch, smilling rarely. She was dressed in a three-piece, tailored suit with off-white straight skirt, plum col-ored blouse, and pale lavendar jacket. The wife of the vice president wears

Though her talk couldn't make up for the cancelled fireworks, her entire presence changed when she spoke of the cancel the gold.

GESTURING, eyes flashing, she spoke of her vision of the arts and it's place in our world and of it's potential

"Art is the truest League of Nations," she said, "speaking a lan-guage understood by all nations." She said that not only businessper-

sons and politicians, but Canadian and American artists have built the friend-ship and intercourse that help us main-tain our long and friendly international border.

As an advocate of the arts, Mrs.

Mondale has traveled more than 70,000
miles in recent months. She is the author of "Politics and Art" written in
1972.

"Art is a special language — it is a unique communicator," she said.
"A painting, a jazz concert, a ballet does not need an interpreter as 1t travels to other countries.
"Art has no one passport — it is a natural citizen."

She termed our cultural exchange with other nations "a window through which other countries can see our life, can learn to understand us and through which we can look at and develop a deeper understanding, of others and their cultures." their cultures."

Mrs. Mondale said we like to send our art abroad and welcome it from other countries.

"We like art to jolt us into fresh in-sights and recognitions," she said. "Art aims to set our senses free. It opens up the windows and lets fresh air in, open-

MRS. MONDALE referred to a re-cent visit to Belgrade, Yugoslavia dur-ing which she opened the United States International Communication Agency Exhibition called "America Now."
