Clothing care for best wear

With the proper care, that new summer outfit you bought this year will wear gracefully from season to season. Good clothing care not only means longer wear — it means better wear. Clean and properly maintained clothing contributes a sense of well-being to the wearer.

Good clothing care practices will also save money. You are less likely to spend money and you can be more discriminating in new clothing purchases if your present wardrobe is clean and in good repair.

The care labels accompanying a garment usually indicate whether it should be laundered or dry cleaned.

When laundering is called for, sort clothing according to colors, durability of fabrics and degree of soil. Prelaudering procedures include emptying pockets, treating spots and stains, and fastening closures.

Make sure you use the recommended combination of detergents, bleaches, fabric softeners and water conditioning agents, as needed.

Pay attention to factors like fabric, fabric finishes, wash cycles, and water and drying temperatures. The same care procedures used in home laundering should be extended to commercial laundering facilities.

To be eligible for the program, a senior must be 60 years of age, or older, and a resident of the county.
