State delegates head for Houston to plan gay march

Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights.

The March has been scheduled for Studay, Oct. 14, and is expected to at-tract more than 100,000 people.

Sylvia Robinson (Detroit), Bill Mu-sick (Plymouth), Ann Broadhurst (Grand Rapids), and Paul Carson (Detroit) are among 200 delegates at the three-day meeting in Houston, the first nationwide meeting of lesbians and gay men based upon regional rep-resentation.

Issues expected to be raised in Hous-ton are: the demands of the march, events which will take place during the weekend of Oct. 14, transportation and housing, financial resources; national structure, protection and security of structure, protection and sec marchers, and media relations.

The delegates are expected to report back to the Detroit-Ann Arbor community at a public rally later this month.

According to Ms. Robinson in a re-cent radio interview, "the march is for everybody — lesbians, Third World

people, children, parents, short people, tall people — we are organizing a broad based group of people who support the rights of lesbians and gay men."

She also called attention to the fact that the same weekend, a national Third World lesbian-gay conference will be held in Washington, D.C., which is co-sponsored by the National Coalition of Black Gays and the National Gay Task Force.

Musick says that the march is a step people can take in mastering the forces which affect their lives.

The four delegates were elected at a statewide meeting held in East Lansing on June 10. Organizations which have endorsed the march include the Association of Suburban People, the Midchigan State Convention of the Midchigan State Convention, the World Workers' Party, and the Revolutionary Socialist League.
