Construction started on new Temple Israel LeVC

After a two year. campaign which raised \$4.7 million in pledges, the 1,600-family Temple Israel congregation has begun construction of a new temple. The building will rise on a 22.5 acre rolling sile on Walnut Lake Road near Drake in West Bloomfield on the \$6,000 square-foot complex will be built around a 1,100 seat, amphibheater-type, sloped sanctuary in the house of the solid point of Jewish worship, the Ark.

A shell-shaped bema (altar) area will be naturally illuminated by a hidden skylight facing southeast to fill the bema area with morning light.

Six stained-glass windows from the congregation's 30-year-old Palmer Park temple will be transferred to the how sanctuary for its completion in the summer of 1980.

Designed by the Bloomfield Hills Jirm of architects, engineers, and planners, TMP Associates, Inc., the temple sanctuary's massive oak doors will open to a skylit atrium forecourt. The atrium will serve both as a gathering room and an overflow area, with room for 600 seats, for large-attendance days such as the High Holy Days. Designed to integrate religious instruction and social functions with worship, the planned temple complex will also have a social hall and adjoining kitchea off the atrium to the left. The social hall will seat 500 for dining and a greater number for assembly, seated auditorium style in front of the hall's stage.



Temple Israel's fund-raising effort, originally initiated in 1973, was quickly curtailed to-direct support of the con-gregation to assisting Israel during its years of crisis in the mid-1978, surveyed in 1977 by Temple Israel president Leslie R. Schmier of Birmingham, building program chairman Samuel W. Barr of Bloomfield Hills, co-chairman Harold Radin of West Bloomfield, and congre-gation treasurer James L. Jonas of Bir-mingham.

Several large donations facilitated the two year fundraising drive includ-ing a \$250,000 bequest from the John R. Herman Foundation.


