Gums need more than mouthwash

Dear Dr. DeFrancesco: My gums are receding. I have tried changing my mouthwash and my tooth-paste, but nothing seems to help. Mrs. M.J.M.

If I were you, I would try talking to your defines.

Your gums may be receding for many reasons.

Accumulated tartar under the gums may have forced away the peridonated membrane. Removal of tartar must be done by a dentist or dental beginning. If I were you, I would try talking to your dentist.

Dear Dr. DeFrancesco: Are X-rays necessary during a routine checkup?

Your dentist depends on X-ray examinations — a necessary part of complete, comprehensive dental care — to help him diagnose and treat conditions that threaten your oral health. Early decay, bone erosion due to gum diseases, impacted teath, tumors and abscesses are all examples of problems that show up in X-rays.

Dear Dr. DeFrancesco: I have had all my teeth extracted and I need full dentures. Most of my friends who have dentures are unhappy because their teeth appear unnatural and false. My mouth is small and I don't want large teeth.

Dentures should look natural. Artificial teeth are made with slight imperfections so that they appear natural; they are made in different sizes and shades. When your dentist is ready to try the dentures in your mouth, invite a relative or friend for an opinion on the appearance of the teeth. Because the teeth are set in a wax matrix at this point, they can still be altered to neleas your still be altered to please you.

Dear Dr. DeFrancesco: My child has no second tooth to push out the baby tooth. Can this tooth be retained to serve as a permanent tooth?

Yes, this tooth can be retained and used as a permanent tooth. How long it can be kept in the mouth is anyone's guess. Many baby teeth have been used for years.

Eventually, the root will be resorbed and the tooth will fall out. This condition can be hereditary.

Dear Dr.DeFrancesco: What can children drink ontaining small amounts of sugar?

Dear Dr. DeFrancesco: Must I go to the dentist's office to have tartar removed from my teeth prop-

Yes. Dentists and dental hygienists are the only persons who are trained to clean hard deposits of

persons who are trained to clean hard deposits of latrar, or calculus, from your teeth.

Their instruments are sharp and often have to be placed beneath the gums, so the removal of tartar could easily injure oral tissues if not done properly. You can help in one way, though. How? By brushing your teeth properly and using dental floss daily, you will cut down on future accumulations of tartar.

Dear Dr. DeFrancesco: Does the average water filter attached to the kitchen faucet remove fluoride from the water supply?

Most filters remove chlorine from the water, but leave fluorides intact.
