MSU student gets practical experience

Michigan State University's James Madison College provides a mix of theory and application in its internship program to help students test their wings before job hunting.

Steven Wachberg of Farmington Hills was one of 30 Madison students to spend one term applying his academic training in a practical work situation. Madison College, a residential col-

lege which specializes in the study of public policy issues, requires all students to work full time for an organization which makes or implements public policy during one of their 12 college terms.

Wachberg, a senior majoring in international relations, spent 10 weeks working as the executive director of Associated Students of MSU, the high-

est branch of campus government.

He was involved in policymaking, implementation of board resolutions and worked extensively in student-university relations and concerns.

Wachberg had been active in ASMSU prior to his internship and fulfilled his James Madison College requirement by giving his involvement a greater emphasis.


He has also served at MSU as the assistant director of state operations and legislative relations, director of legislative affairs, co-chairman of the Young Democrats organization.
