## Chatham Square hails festival

Whether you want to break a world record, get a deal from a flea market or dance to the old-time band tunes, Chatham Square Shopping Center will offer it all during Founders Festival.

Chatham Square, on Eleven Mile and Middlebelt, will conduct festival activities July 27-29.

Among the records to aim for are:

ice cream eating, present record is 3 pounds, 6 ounces in 30 seconds; golf ball balancing, present record is six new golf balls stacked vertically, donut eating, present record is 29 donuts in seven minutes, 16 seconds; balancing on one leg, present record is 13 hours without putting leg down; potato chip eating, present record is 30-ounce bags in 24 minutes.

Other records to be challenged are: yo-yo loops, 20,302 in three hours; banana eating, 17 in two minutes; hard boiled eggs, 14 in 58 seconds; and milk drinking, one imperial quart in 3.2 seconds.

The less ambitious can content themselves with the flea market on July 29, from 12-6 p.m.

## School board votes to fund roof repairs

The Farmington Board of Education voted to spend \$219,580 for roof repairs at three district schools during a special meeting last Thursday.

The district entered into an agreement with Armo Roofing for work at Eagle Elementary School at a cost of \$65,700; with P.F. LaDuke Roofing for work at Kenbrook Elementary School costing \$55,880; and with Firebaugh and Reynolds for work at Farmington High at a cost of \$94,000.

Funds will come from the bonding project.

"The roofing season is short and we are anxious to get this work done before students go back to school," said School Superintendent Lewis Schulman.

Administrators described the roofs at the three schools as being in "deplorable condition." One said that anyone walking across the roof at Eagle might fall through the holes.

The next step of the bonding project

will provide funds for roofing at Beechview, Gill, Shawwassee, William Grace and Wooddale elementary schools and North Farmington High School.

"We need to budget \$260,000 every year to keep our roofs in shape," said Bill Prisk, school finance director.

Voting for the action were trustees James McGlinchey and Janice Rohnick; Dick Wallace, treasurer; Jack Inch, vice president; and Michael Spiece, board president.

Board members Helen Prutow and Emma Makinen were not present.

Also attending the meeting were Jack Lawing, director of administrative services, and Bob Filisko, supplier and a consultant from the Roofers Association.

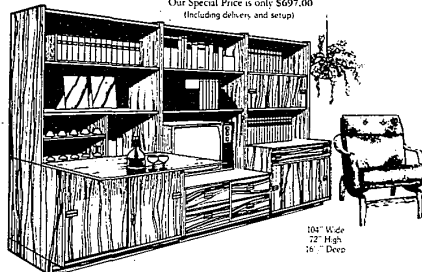

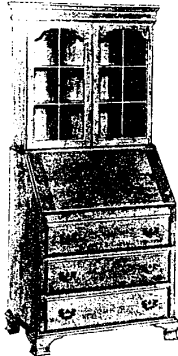
