Tavern-turned-home tells story

When Lee and Ann Juliano bought the Philbrick Tavers on Power near 11 Mile seven years ago, thy 148-year-old home was in poor condition.
"There was a lot of misuse," said Mrs. Juliano. "There were renters in the house and some people changed the walls. We dort know how it was originallly."
They restored the old tavern so it kept its original appearance outside

but offered modern conveniences inside.

WHEN THEY FIRST moved in, the wooden floors in the home buckled with humidity and a carpet had to be tacked over them.

They refinished the wooden floors in They relinished the wooden floors in the dining room which remain from the days the home was a tavain. But the soft wood can be easily denied when children play on it, so the Julianos have covered most of the floor with rugs.

The basement, which has been cov-ered with cement, lacks any clues to with Cement, lacks any clues to the home's past. While Mrs. Juliano concedes that the value of the home and its taxes will probably rise if its included in the his-toric district she would like to see the home preserved.

"IT'S ONE OF A KIND," she said. They wouldn't want to see someone buy the home only to tear it down.

Although the historic value of the home wasn't the reason they purchased it, they enjoy that aspect of the tavern. Occasionally school children will ask to see the basement of the home which is rumored to be a link in the Underground Railroad. So far, the Julianos haven't seen anything which would indicate the home was a station in the movement to help slaves escape. A few years ago when they dug a pool in the backyard, they didn't lind any indications of a tunnel. The basement, which has been covher of the ad hoc committee, owns one of the 70 homes under consideration. Part of her house was built in 1835 as a farm house.
