

Notify police and a trusted neighbor of your planned absence, and the length of time you'll be away. Don't discuss your absence in public, and don't give out information about your wacation to newspapers, you can give details when you return. There's only one small question tugging uneasily in the back of your mind: will the house one Shart question website. the back of your mind: will the house be secure? No one can be completely save from household break-ins, but Farmington Police Lieutenant John Santomauro offers this advice to potential travelers. "We don't have a house check, but we request residents to notify us when leaving town. Give us information so we know who to contact if the place needs to be secured," he said. "We can't guarantee the house won't be burglarized, but if you follow some of these suggestions, chances are better of not being broken into." *Have lawns mowed and yard work. Move valuables so they can't be seen from porch windows. Be sure you have a list of small appliances and valuables. Use clock timer or a photo electric relay to turn lights on and off at cer-tain times, giving the house an occu-pied look.
